We had a wide variety of missions ranging from saving lives in house fires to rescuing animals trapped underneath concrete slabs. When no one else knows the answer to a problem; people rely on the fire department. We are problem solvers and we will get results.



### **ZODIAC TRAILER**






We used budgeted funds to purchase 1000' of 5" supply line for Engine 1.




